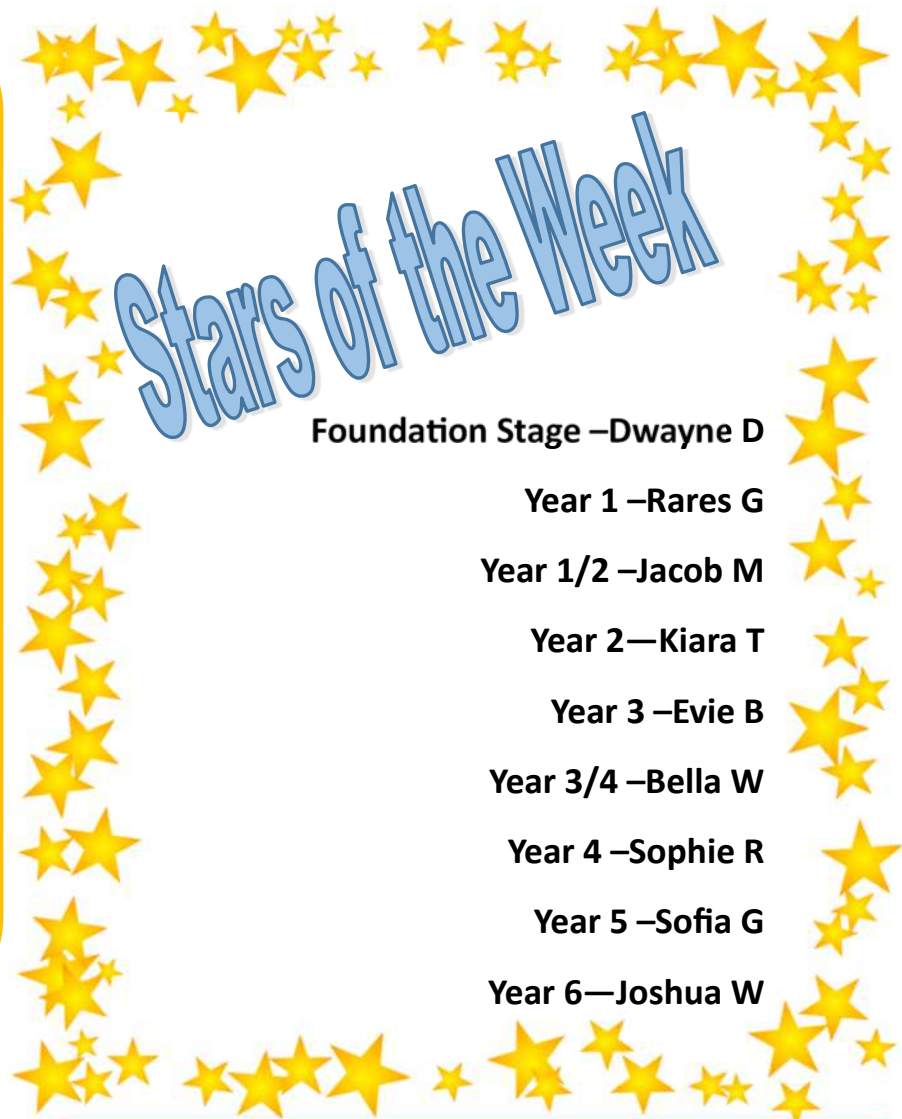
**Message from Mr Knight**
